Sub. : Implementation of provisions of amended Rule 45 of MCDR, 1988 – Registration of miners, traders, stockist, exporters and end users.


Sir,

As per the amended Rule 45 of Mineral Conservation & Development Rules 1988, which have been notified in the Gazette of India vide G.S.R:75(E) on 9th February, 2011, it is mandatory for owner, agent, mining engineer or manager of every mine, or any person or company engaged in trading or storage or end-use or export of minerals to apply for registration number online at <http://ibm.gov.in/> or <http://ibm.nic.in/> and get themselves registered with Indian Bureau of Mines. It is also necessary, for a person, company or firm, as the case may be, to indicate the registration number in all types of transaction related with minerals, right from producer to end-users. All the stake holders, dealing with minerals, had to apply for registration number within one month of the commencement of above rules notified on 9th February, 2011.

However, it has been noticed that many mine owners, traders, stockists, exporters and end-users have not so far applied for registration number with Indian Bureau of Mines due to which the movement of the minerals can not be monitored effectively.

In view of the above, it is requested to instruct the concerned authorities in your state to strictly implement the amended rule 45 of Mineral Conservation & Development Rules 1988 and insist for the registration number in all type of transactions related with minerals and its end products including movement of minerals.
