Subject: Violation of provisions of Mineral Conservation & Development Rules, 2017 in respect of your **Bistara Limestone Mine (4.57 Hect.)** in **Katni** district of **M.P. State**.

Sir,

The following provisions of the Mineral Conservation and Development Rules, 2017 were found violated in your above mentioned mine during the inspection by Shri Abhishek Ranjan Gautam, Assistant Mining Engineer on 18.10.2022 in presence of Shri K K Chandra, Manager Mines & Shri Vinod Patel, Mining Engineer detailed as below:-

नियम स.	पाए गए उल्लंघन की विस्तृत प्रकृति
Rule 11 (1)	<p>According to this rule-No holder of a mining lease shall commence or carry out mining operation in any area except in accordance with the mining plan approved, modified or reviewed by the Indian Bureau of Mines or prepared and certified in accordance with the system established by the State Govt. pursuant to the provisions to clause (b) of Sub Section (2) of Section 5 or approved by the competent authority of the Atomic Minerals Directorate for exploration and Researching respect of minerals specified in Part B of the First Schedule of the Act where the grade of such atomic minerals is equal to or above the threshold value limit declared under schedule-A of the Atomic Mineral Concession Rules 2016.</p> <p>The modification of approved Mining Plan of above mentioned mine was approved vide this office letter No-MP/Katni/Limestone/MPLN/MOD-03/2020-21 dated 02.09.2020 incorporating the proposals for 2021-22. During the inspection it was found that following provisions of rule have been violated.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. It was proposed to produce 139180 metric tons of Limestone in the year 2021-22 but only 103550 tons production achieved and reported.2. It was proposed to remove 61393 M³ of Over Burden in the year 2021-22 but only 28040 M³ Over Burden removed as per office record.3. It was proposed to remove 875 M³ of Top Soil in the year 2021-22 but achieved as nil. <p>The mine development was lagging from the approved proposal.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">4. Boundary pillars are not maintained properly as per rule.
Rule 27 (2)	<p>MCDR 2017 has been amended vide Gazettes notification dated 03/11/2021 wherein the rate of financial assurance has been increased from Rs 3 Lakh to 5 Lakh per hectare of area put to use for mining & allied activities in case of 'A' category mines. Furnish additional Financial assurance of Rs 669000 /- (1351000 already submitted) as required to submit.</p>

Rule 34	<p>34A. Digital aerial images of mining lease area.— (1) Every lessee having— (a) an annual excavation plan of one million tonne or more in a particular year; or (b) leased area of fifty hectare or more, shall carry out a drone survey of the leased area and upto hundred metres outside the lease boundary in the month of April or May every year and submit the processed output [digital elevation model (DEM) and Orthomosaic] images obtained from such survey or any other format as may be specified by the Indian Bureau of Mines in this regard to the Controller General on or before 1st day of July every year.</p> <p>(2) Every lessee, other than those covered under sub-rule (1), shall submit soft copy of high resolution Georeferenced Ortho-rectified Multispectral satellite images of the leased area and upto hundred metres outside the lease boundary taken in the month of April to June of every year, to the Controller General on or before 1st day of July of the that year in the standards formats such as GeoTIFF along with metadata or any other format as may be specified by the Indian Bureau of Mines in this regard: You have not submitted satellite image as specified above under rule 34A (2) of MCDR 2017.</p>
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02. In this connection it is brought to your notice that the above violations constitute an offence punishable under Rule 62 of MCDR-2017.
03. Non-compliance of the rule 11(1) of MCDR-2017 may lead to suspension of Mining operations under the provisions of rule 11(2) of MCDR-2017.
04. You are advised to rectify the above violations immediately and intimate the position to this office within 45 (Forty-Five) days from the date of issue of this letter.
