## SECTION – 1

### Mineral Legislation and Policy on Export and Import of Minerals/ Ores

#### 1. Mineral Legislation

##### A. Amendments/Notifications:

**1) Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue), G.S.R. 64(E)**— In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (1) of Section 25 of the Customs Act, 1962 (52 of 1962), the Central Government, on being satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest so to do, hereby, makes the following further amendments in the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue), No. 27/2011-Customs, dated 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2011 which was published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, vide number G.S.R. 153(E), dated 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2011, namely :—

In the said notification, in the Table, against serial number 23, in column (4), for the entry “Nil”, the entry “5%” shall be substituted.

**Note:**—The principal notification No. 27/2011-Customs, dated 1st March, 2011 was published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part II, Section 3, Sub-section (i) vide number G.S.R. 153(E), dated 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2011, and was last amended vide notification No. 15/2013-Customs, dated 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2013, the published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part II, Section 3, Sub-section (i) vide number G.S.R. 138(E), dated 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2013.

**2) Ministry of Mines, F. NO 4(2)2012-M.I.** — In continuation of the Resolution of Ministry of Mines published, vide Gazette Notification No.4 (2)97-M.I dated 12.03.2009 regarding reconstitution of Central Geological Programming Board and 12 Committees thereunder for various sub-sectors, it has been decided that the para immediately under the heading ‘XII: Geoscience for Sustainable Development’ on p-48 shall be replaced by the following:—

**3) Ministry of Environment and Forests, G.S.R. 185(E).** — In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 (69 of 1980), the Central Government, hereby, makes the following rules further to amend the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2003, namely: -

1. (1) These rules may be called the Forest (Conservation) Amendment Rules, 2014.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. In the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2003 (hereinafter referred to as the said rules), in

rule 2, (i) after clause (b), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-

“(ba) “Conservator of Forests” means an officer appointed by the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, under the designation of Conservator of Forests or the Chief Conservator of Forests or the Regional Chief Conservator of Forests or any such similar designation, to hold charge of a Forest Circle having jurisdiction over the forest land for which the approval of the Central Government under the Act is required;”.

(ii) after clause (c), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-

“(ca) “Divisional Forest Officer” means an officer appointed by the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, under the designation of the Divisional Forest Officer or the Deputy Conservator of Forests or any such similar designation, to hold charge of a Forest Division having jurisdiction over the forest land for which the approval of the Central Government under the Act is required;”

3. In the said rules, for rule 6 and 7, the following rules shall be substituted, namely:-

**“6. Submission of proposal seeking approval of the Central Government under Section 2 of the Act.-**

(1) Every User Agency that wants to use any forest land for non-forest purposes, shall make its proposal in the relevant Form appended to these rules, namely; Form ‘A’ for proposal seeking first time approval under the Act, Form ‘B’ for proposal seeking renewal of leases, where approval of the Central Government under the Act had already been obtained, and Form ‘C’ for prospecting of minerals, to the Nodal Officer of the concerned State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, along with requisite information and documents, complete in all respect.

(2) The User Agency shall endorse a copy of the proposal, along with a copy of the receipt obtained from the office of the Nodal Officer to the concerned Divisional Forest Officer, District Collector and Regional Office as well as the Monitoring Cell of the Forest Conservation Division of the Ministry of Environment and Forests.

(3) (a) The Nodal Officer of the State Government or the Union territory Administration, as the case may be, after having received the proposal under sub-rule (1) and on being satisfied that the proposal is complete in all respects and requires prior approval under Section 2 of the Act, shall send the proposal to the concerned Divisional Forest Officer and the District Collector within a period of ten days of the receipt of the proposal.

(b) If the Nodal Officer of the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, finds that the proposal is incomplete, he shall return it within a period of ten days to the User Agency and this time period and the time taken by the User Agency to re-submit the proposal shall not be counted for any future reference.

(c) The Divisional Forest Officer shall examine the factual details and feasibility of the proposal, certify the maps, carry out site-inspection and enumeration of the trees and forward his findings in the Format specified in this regard to the Conservator of Forests.

(d) The Divisional Forest Officer shall process and forward the application along with his findings on the proposal involving forest land up to forty hectares, above forty hectares and up to one hundred hectares and above one hundred hectares to the Conservator of Forests within a period of thirty days, forty five days and sixty days, respectively.

(e) The District Collector shall complete the process for settlement of rights in accordance with the provisions of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 (2 of 2007) (hereinafter referred to as the FRA), obtain consent of the Gram Sabha or Gram Sabhas, wherever required, and forward his findings in the Format specified in this regard to the Conservator of Forests.

(f) The District Collector shall forward the proposal along with his findings on settlement of rights under FRA and consent of the Gram Sabha or Gram Sabhas, wherever required, in respect of the proposal involving forest land up to forty hectares, above forty hectares and up to one hundred hectares and above one hundred hectares to the Conservator of Forests within a period of thirty days, forty five days and sixty days, respectively.

(g) The Conservator of Forests shall examine the factual details and feasibility of the proposal, carry out site-inspection in case the area of forest land proposed to be diverted is more than forty hectares, and forward the proposal along with his recommendations and the report on settlement of rights under the FRA and consent of the concerned Gram Sabha or Gram Sabhas, wherever required, received from the District Collector to the Nodal Officer.

(h) The time taken by the Conservator of Forests to process and forward to the Nodal Officer the proposal involving forest land up to forty hectares and above forty hectares shall not be more than ten days and thirty days, respectively.

(i) The Nodal Officer, through the Principal Chief Conservator of Forest, shall forward the proposal to the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, along with his recommendations.

(j) The Nodal Officer shall process and forward the proposal along with his findings on the proposal involving forest land, up to five hectares, above five hectares and up to forty hectares, above forty hectares up to one hundred hectares and above one hundred hectares, to the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, within a period of ten days, twenty days, twenty five days and thirty days, respectively.

(k) In case the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, decides not to, de-reserve or divert for non-forest purpose or assign on lease the forest land indicated in the proposal, as the case may be, the same shall be intimated to the User Agency within thirty days of the receipt of proposal from the Nodal Officer:

Provided, all proposals involving diversion of forest land for projects of the Central Government or Central Government Undertakings where the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, does not agree in principle to de-reserve or divert for non-forest purpose or assign on lease the forest land indicated in the proposal, as the case may be, shall be forwarded to the Central Government along with comments of the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be.

(l) The State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, shall forward along with its recommendations all those proposals where State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, agrees in principle to de-reserve or divert for non-forest purpose or assign on lease the forest land indicated in the proposal, as the case may be, and all proposals involving diversion of forest land for projects of the Central Government or Central Government Undertakings, to the Central Government within thirty days:

Provided that the all proposals involving felling of trees on forest land or a portion thereof for the purpose of using it for reafforestation shall be sent in the form of Working Plan or Working Scheme or Management Plan:

Provided further that the concerned State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, shall simultaneously send the intimation to the User Agency about forwarding of the proposal, along with its recommendations, to the Regional Office or the Ministry of Environment and Forests, as the case may be:

Provided also that total time taken exclusively for transit of a proposal between various authorities in the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, shall not be more than twenty days, over and above the time period specified for processing of proposal by each authority.

(m) Whenever the time taken by the State Government or the Union territory Administration, as the case may be, for processing the proposal exceeds the time limits stipulated in clauses (a) to (l) above, the proposal shall be considered by the Central Government only if an explanation for the delay is furnished to the satisfaction of the Central Government, together with action taken against any individual held to be responsible for the delay.

(4) (a) The proposal referred to in clause (l) of sub-rule (3), involving forest land up to forty hectares shall be forwarded by the concerned State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, along with its recommendations, to the concerned Regional Office.

(b) The proposal referred to in clause (l) of sub-rule (3), involving forest land of more than forty hectares shall be forwarded by the concerned State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, along with its recommendations, to the Secretary, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India.

(c) The proposals referred to in clause (l) of sub-rule (3), involving clearing of trees in forest land or portion thereof for the purpose of using it for re-forestation shall be sent to the concerned Regional Office.

**7. Processing of proposals received by the Central Government.** – (1) (a) The Regional Office, after having received the proposal referred in clause (a) and clause (c) of sub-rule (4) of rule 6 shall determine the completeness of proposal within five working days.

(b) If the Regional Office finds that the proposal is incomplete, it shall return it within the period of five working days as specified under clause (a), to the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, and this time period and the time taken by the State Government to re-submit the proposal shall not be counted for any future reference.

(2) (a) The Regional Office shall after examination of the proposal involving forest land up to five hectares other than the proposal relating to mining and encroachments, which are complete in all respect, and after such further enquiry as it may consider necessary, grant in-principle approval subject to fulfillment of stipulated conditions, or reject the same within twenty five days of its receipt from the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, and communicate the same to the concerned State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, within next five days.

(b) The proposals involving forest land above five hectares and up to forty hectares and all proposals for regularisation of encroachments and mining up to forty hectares, which are complete in all respects, shall be examined by the Regional Office in consultation with an Advisory Group consisting of representatives of the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, from Revenue Department, Forest Department, Planning Department or Finance Department and the concerned Department whose proposal is being examined.

(c) The Regional Office shall within a period of thirty five days of the receipt of the proposal from the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, shall forward such proposal along with views of the Advisory Group to the Secretary, Ministry of Environment and Forests for obtaining the decision of the Central Government:

Provided that time taken in transit of a proposal from Regional Office to the Ministry of Environment and Forests shall not be more than five days.

(d) The Central Government shall, after considering the views of the Advisory Group and after further enquiry as it may consider necessary, grant in-principle approval subject to fulfillment of stipulated conditions, or reject the same within thirty days of its receipt from the Regional Office and communicate the same to the concerned State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, within next five working days.

(3) (a) All proposals involving clearing of trees in forest land or portion thereof for the purpose of using it for re-forestation shall be finally disposed of by the Regional Office within a period of sixty days of receipt of the proposals from the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be.

(b) While examining the proposal, the Regional Office shall ensure that the final decision is in conformity with the National Forest Policy, Working Plan guidelines and other relevant rules and guidelines issued by the Central Government from time to time.

(c) The Regional Office shall however seeks prior clearance of the Ministry of Environment and Forests whenever the proposal involves clear-felling of forest land having crown density above forty per cent irrespective of the area involved, or clear-felling of forest area of size more than twenty hectares in the plains and ten hectares in the hilly region, irrespective of density.

(4) (a) The Ministry of Environment and Forests, after having received the proposal referred to in clause (b) of sub-rule (4) of rule 6 shall determine the completeness of the proposal within ten days.

(b) If the Ministry of Environment and Forests finds that the proposal is incomplete, it shall return it within the period of ten days as specified under clause (a), to the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, and this time period and the time taken by the State Government to resubmit the proposal shall not be counted for any future reference.

(c) In case the proposal involves forest land more than one hundred hectares, Ministry of Environment and Forest shall within ten days of the receipt of a proposal complete in all respects, request the concerned Regional Office to inspect the forest land proposed to be diverted and submit a report to the Ministry of Environment and Forest within a period of forty five days:

Provided that the total time taken in communication of the request for site inspection from the Ministry of Environment and Forests to Regional Office and communication of the site inspection report from the Regional Office to the Ministry of Environment and Forests shall not be more than ten days, over and above the time taken in undertaking site inspection by the Regional Office.

(d) The Central Government shall refer every proposal, which is complete in all respects, received by it under clause (b) of sub-rule (4) of rule 6 including site inspection reports, wherever required, to the Committee for its advice and the Committee shall give its advice within thirty days from the date of receipt of the said proposal.

(e) The Committee shall have due regard to all or any of the following matters while tendering its advice on the proposals referred to it under clause (d), namely:-

(i) whether the forests land proposed to be used for non-forest purpose forms part of a nature reserve, national park, wildlife sanctuary, biosphere reserve or forms part of the habitat of any endangered or threatened species of flora and fauna or of an area lying severely eroded catchment;

(ii) whether the use of any forest land is for agricultural purposes or for the rehabilitation of persons displaced from their residences by reason of any river valley or hydro-electric project;

(iii) whether the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, has certified that it has considered all other alternatives and that no other alternatives in the circumstances are feasible and that the required area is the minimum needed for the purpose;

(iv) whether the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, undertakes to provide at its cost for the acquisition of land of an equivalent area and afforestation thereof;

(v) whether the per unit requirement of forest land is significantly higher than the national average for similar projects; and

(vi) whether the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, before making their recommendation has considered all issues having direct and indirect impact of the diversion of forest land on forest, wildlife and environment.

(f) While tendering advice, the Committee may also suggest any condition or restriction on the use of any forest land for any non-forest purpose, which in its opinion would minimize adverse environmental impact.

(g) The Central Government shall, after considering the advice of the Committee under clause (e) and clause (f) and after such further enquiry as it may consider necessary, grant in-principle approval subject to fulfillment of stipulated conditions, or reject the same within thirty days of the receipt of advice from the Committee and communicate the same to the concerned State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, within next five working days.

**8. Submission of report on compliance to conditions stipulated in the in-principle approval and grant of final approval.** (1) (a) The Nodal Officer shall within five days of receipt of the in-principle approval, endorse a copy of the same to the concerned Divisional Forest Officer and the Conservator of Forests;

(b) On receipt of a copy of the in-principle approval, the Divisional Forest Officer shall prepare a demand note containing item-wise amount of compensatory levies such as cost of creation and maintenance of compensatory afforestation, Net Present Value (NPV), cost of implementation of catchment area treatment plan or wildlife conservation plan etc. to be paid by the User Agency and communicate the same, along with a list of documents, certificates and undertakings required to be

submitted by the User Agency in compliance with the conditions stipulated in the in-principle approval to the User Agency within ten days of the receipt of a copy of the in-principle approval.

(c) The User Agency shall within thirty days of receipt of demand note and list of documents, certificates and undertakings from the Divisional Forest Officer make payment of compensatory levies and submit a compliance report containing a copy of documentary evidence in respect of the payment of compensatory levies along with documents, certificates and undertakings indicated in the said list to Divisional Forest Officer.

(d) The Divisional Forest Officer, after having received the compliance report shall determine its completeness within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the User Agency.

(e) If the Divisional Forest Officer finds that the compliance report is incomplete, he shall communicate the shortcoming or shortcomings in the compliance report to the User Agency within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the User Agency and if the compliance report is complete in all respect, it shall be forwarded to the Conservator of Forests within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the User Agency.

(f) The Conservator of Forests, after having received the compliance report shall determine its completeness within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Divisional Forest Officer.

(g) If the Conservator of Forests finds that the compliance report is incomplete, he shall communicate the shortcoming or shortcomings in the compliance report to the User Agency and the Divisional Forest Officer within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Divisional Forest Officer and if the compliance report is complete in all respects, it shall be forwarded to the Nodal Officer within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Divisional Forest Officer.

(h) The Nodal Officer, after having received the compliance report shall determine its completeness within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Conservator of Forests.

(i) If the Nodal Officer finds that the compliance report is incomplete, he shall communicate the shortcoming or shortcomings in the compliance report to the User Agency, the Conservator of Forests and the Divisional Forest Officer within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Conservator of Forests and if the compliance report is complete in all respects, it shall be forwarded to the State Government or Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Conservator of Forests.

(j) The State Government or Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, after having received the compliance report shall determine its completeness within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Nodal Officer.

(k) If the State Government or Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, finds that the compliance report is incomplete, it shall communicate the shortcoming or shortcomings in the compliance report to the User Agency, the Nodal Officer, the Conservator of Forests and the Divisional Forest Officer within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Nodal Officer and if the compliance report is complete in all respects, it shall be forwarded to the Ministry of Environment

and Forests or the Regional Office, as the case may be, within a period of fifteen days of its receipt from the Nodal Officer.

(l) The Ministry of Environment and Forests or the Regional Office, as the case may be, after having received the compliance report shall determine its completeness within a period of fifteen days.

(m) If the Ministry of Environment and Forests or the Regional Office, as the case may be, finds that the compliance report is complete in all respect, it shall accord the final approval under the Act and communicate the same to the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, within a period of twenty days of the receipt of a compliance report which is complete in all respect.

(n) The report on fulfillment of shortcoming or shortcomings in the compliance report shall be processed and forwarded to authorities concerned in the State Government or the Union territory administration, as the case may be, and the Central Government in the manner and within the time limits stipulated in clause (d) to clause (l) above.

(2) (a) In cases where compliance of conditions stipulated in the in-principle approval is awaited for more than five years from the State Government or the Union Territory Administration, as the case may be, the in-principle approvals shall be summarily revoked.

## **B. Court Decisions:**

### **1. M/s. Shiv Guru Stone Works & Another, Petitioners v. State of Jharkhand & Others, Respondents., AIR 2014, Jharkhand 28, Vol.101, Part 1204, April 2014.**

**Subject :** Challenging the refusal of renewal applications.

**Facts :** The applications for renewal of mining lease have been cancelled by the orders dt.14.7.2012 inter alia on the ground that the area in question fall within 400 metres from the reserved forest area; the Divisional Forest Officer, Giridih has reported against such renewal, vide letter, dated 11.6.2012, on the said ground and environmental clearance for obtaining such renewal of lease, has not been obtained. The question of grant of environmental clearance for such projects, which has been made a mandatory requirement before renewal of such mining lease whether minor or mineral or a particular size below five hectares or above that. This obviously has been done pursuant to the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, dated 27.2.2012 in SLP (C) Nos. 19628-19629 of 2009. The State Pollution Control Board has also subsequently issued letter, dated 14.5.2012 acting upon the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court. As per the said letter, the petitioner is required to obtain environmental clearance from the State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA), which has been constituted by the Central Government, vide notification, dated 27.12.2012. The State Government has, thereafter, issued a public notice, dated 7.4.2013 whereby in pursuance of the powers under the Environment Protection Act, 1986 and also in furtherance of the notification of the Government of India, the State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority-SEIAA and the State Expert Appraisal Committee-SEAC have been made functional, and after scrutiny of these applications, the State Level Environmental Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) will take a decision upon it for grant of environmental clearance.

**Decision :** The High Court has directed/ ordered to the petitioners to approach the State Level Environmental Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) with proper application in the prescribed form with all such necessary requirements along with prescribed fee, etc. within a period of two weeks. On receipt of duly filled application, the State Level Environmental Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) shall proceed to scrutinize the same in accordance with law and it is expected that an appropriate decision will be taken thereupon by the concerned authority within a reasonable period preferably within a period of ten weeks thereafter.

Order accordingly.

### **2. M/s. Shreydeep Stone Crusher, Petitioner v. State of M.P. & another, Respondents, AIR 2014 Madhya Pradesh 49, Vol.101, Part 1204, April, 2014.**

**Subject :** Challenging the power, jurisdiction and authority of the Collector for cancellation of the lease.

**Facts :** The petitioner was granted a quarry lease of a land area 4.800 hectares of survey No.360, 361, 362 and 365, situated at village Mau, District Gwalior under the provisions of M.P. Minor Mineral Rules, 1996 (hereinafter referred as the 'Rules of 1996') for a period of ten years from 22.3.2007 to 21.5.2017. He was granted NOC from the relevant departments. The petitioner

established a crusher for converting minerals into B.T. Metal. He had received loans from the bank. The lease was cancelled by the Collector, vide order, dated 29.10.2011. He challenged the aforesaid order in a writ petition, which was registered as W.P.No.7535/2011. Division Bench of this Court, vide order dated 30.01.2012 disposed of the writ petition and directed that the impugned order, Annexure P-1, is hereby, quashed subject to conditions that the petitioner shall ensure compliance of the directions mentioned in para 27 of this order and the Committee, as mentioned in the aforesaid para, shall ensure proper compliance and in the event of failure of the compliance, the department would be at liberty to take appropriate action.

The Collector granted permission to the petitioner to continue mining operations, vide order dated 03.03.2012. A show cause notice was issued by the Collector on 2.4.2012 to the petitioner. The petitioner submitted reply to the aforesaid show cause notice, and denied the fact that the water sprinkler system was insufficient. He further submitted that he was willing to obey all the conditions, which may be imposed by the Collector. In pursuance to the show cause notice, the Collector constituted a Committee to verify the facts mentioned by the petitioner in the reply. The Committee inspected the spot on 3.6.2012, prepared a panchnama and recorded findings. Another Committee was constituted by the Collector in December 2012 and it again inspected the mining sites and recorded following findings and submitted a memorandum to the Collector. On the basis of findings and memorandum, the Collector passed impugned order of termination of lease on 24.12.2012. The petitioner filed an appeal against the order of cancellation of lease. The appellate authority, vide order dated 29.6.2013 dismissed the appeal on the ground that a Special Leave Petition was pending before Hon'ble Supreme Court. The petitioner filed a revision petition before the State Government, that was also dismissed, vide order dated 23.11.2013 on the ground that the enquiry committee in its report recorded findings that the petitioner had violated the directions issued by this Court. An application was also filed before the National Green Tribunal. National Green Tribunal closed the case because the matter was pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court.

Learned senior counsel for the petitioner has contended that the Collector has not followed the mandatory provisions of Rule 30 (26) of the Rules of 1996 and no show cause notice was issued to the petitioner before cancellation of mining lease. The petitioner was not given time to rectify the mistakes in accordance with the provisions of rules. He further contended that the petitioner had not violated any terms and conditions and the petitioner is willing to abide by all the terms and conditions which may be imposed by the authority. He relied on the judgments in the cases *Satwati Deswal v. State of Haryana* (AIR 2009 SC (Supp) 2956) and *Assam Sillimanite Ltd v. Union of India*, (AIR 1990 SC 1417). Learned Government Advocate has submitted that the petitioner has violated the terms and conditions and directions issued by this Court, hence, the Collector has rightly passed the order. He also contended that this court has no jurisdiction to hear the petition in view of the provisions of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010 (hereinafter referred to the 'Act of 2010').

**Decision :** The High Court has referred to Rule 30(26) of the Rules of 1996 and stated that the Collector did not issue any show cause notice to the petitioner on the basis of second enquiry conducted by the Committee on 4.12.2012 neither the petitioner had been given time to remedy the breach. The statutory provision provides that the lease holder be given time to remedy the breach of 60 days and a show cause notice be also issued to him giving him an opportunity to show

cause that why he should not be penalized for the breach committed by him. The High Court has further stated that earlier show cause notice was issued to the petitioner on 2.4.2012. At that time, it was found that the petitioner did not commit any breach. When subsequent Committee noticed that the petitioner had committed certain breach, then it was obligatory on the part of the Collector to issue show cause notice to the petitioner and grant him time to remedy the breach in accordance with Rule 30(26) of the Rules of 1996.

The High Court has referred to the decision given in the case Assam Sillimanite Ltd v. Union of India (supra) wherein it was held that in the event of premature termination of mining lease, an opportunity of hearing to the petitioner must be accorded in accordance with the principles of natural justice.

The High Court has also referred to Section 14 of the Green Tribunal, Act, 2010 and stated that the tribunal has jurisdiction to hear the civil cases where a substantial question relating to environment and enforcement of enactments specified in Schedule I is involved. In the aforesaid Schedule, there is no mention of the termination of lease granted to a lease holder. In the present case, the lease of the petitioner was cancelled. Hence, in our opinion, the jurisdiction of this Court is not ousted in view of the provisions of Act of 2010.

The High Court has stated that when the Collector passed the order of cancellation of lease of the petitioner i.e. 24.12.2012, on the aforesaid date, in accordance with the Rule 6, which is in vogue, at that time, the Collector had no power and authority to grant or cancel the lease of minerals accorded to the petitioner because the area of the land is more than 4 hectares. The lease was for making gitti by mechanical crushing mentioned at Sl.No.6 of Schedule I of Rule 6 of the Rules of 1996.

The High Court has held that the State Government subsequently, vide another notification dated 23.3.2013 substituted Rule 6 of the Rules of 1996 and accorded power to the Collector/Additional Collector (Senior IAS Scale) in respect of grant of quarry lease of minerals specified in Schedule I and Schedule II having an area of 10.00 hectares. The aforesaid rule is not retrospective in nature. It came into effect from the date of publication of notification in the gazette, i.e., w.e.f. 23.3.2013. Hence, the order passed by the Collector in regard to cancellation of the lease is void ab initio being without any power and jurisdiction and authority, hence, it could not be cured at subsequent stage.

Lastly, the High Court has allowed the writ petition and quashed the impugned orders dated 24.12.2012, dated 29.6.2013 and dated 23.11.2013.

Petition allowed.

**3. Federation of India Mineral Industries, New Delhi and another, Petitioners v. State of Odisha and others, Respondents, AIR 2014 Odisha 105, Vol.101 Part 1206, June, 2014.**

**Subject :** Challenging the common question raised in this group of writ petitions about the validity of Memo No.8620/SM dated 5<sup>th</sup> December, 2012 issued by the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Odisha, Steel and Mines Department and also prayed to quash the same.

**Facts:** It was mentioned in the said memo that the State Government, hereby, directs that at least 50% of the iron ore lumps and 50% of the fines won from the mines in any month, but not put to captive use by the lessees, shall be sold to the stand alone mineral based industries located in the State, limited to the requirements of such user industries, in an equitable manner, on payment of the prevailing fair market price by the user industries to the mining lessees. It is submitted that the State based iron ore industries are facing acute shortage of iron ore, seriously affecting the production. Few of them are facing closure and others are experiencing low utilisation of their existing capacity. There is likelihood of adverse socio-economic consequences of unemployment, loss of wages and impact on investment climate and industrialisation process in the State. Therefore, it became necessary, in the greater public interest, to take measures to make adequate raw material available to the State based industries so as to maintain the pace of industrial growth and avoid adverse socio economic consequences. The exercise of power purports to be under Rule 27(1)(m) of the Mineral Concession Rules, 1960 (MCR) which provides that the State Government shall at all times have the right of pre-emption of the minerals won from the land in respect of which the lease has been granted on payment of fair market price.

Petitioner have submitted that the State Legislature has no competence to enact any law on the subject nor the State has competence to exercise executive power except in accordance with the Scheme of MMDR Act. Section 13 empowers the Central Government to make rules for regulating the grant of reconnaissance permits, prospecting licences and mining leases for minerals (other than minor minerals) while the power to make rules for regulating the grant of quarry leases, mining leases or mineral concessions in respect of minor minerals is with the State Governments. The MMDR Act or MCR do not provide for exercise of right of pre-emption before any minerals are won from the land in respect of which the lease has been granted. The said right cannot make the grant of mining lease redundant. Clause 21(a) of the Mining Lease (in Form-K) requires the State Government to issue notice for the purpose of exercising the right of pre-emption in absence of which the said right cannot be exercised.

The demand of iron ore from the Iron and Steel Industry in the State of Odisha is around 12-13% of the actual demand and thus the mining lessees can not sell 50% of the iron ore extracted from the mines to the industries situated in the State. The Central Government, vide letter dated 13<sup>th</sup> February, 2013 advised the State Government to withdraw the impugned memo on the ground that the right of pre-emption vested in the State cannot be transferred to mineral based industries in the State and the condition imposed amounted to a special condition of lease, without approval of the Central Government, as required under Rule 27(3) of the MCR. In view of the impugned memo, the lessees are denied permits for transportation of minerals beyond 50% of the produce. Thus, the impugned condition is an unreasonable restriction on the right of lessees under Article 19(g) and also violates Article 301 of the Constitution of India.

State of Odisha in a counter affidavit stated that State is the owner of mineral resources within its territories and right of pre-emption is in acknowledgment of the State's ownership rights for equitable distribution of the natural resources and greater common good. Mineral resources in the State are being exploited since long by the stand alone miners without commensurate benefit to the State and the community. The benefits to the State from stand alone mining were meager

compared to the super normal profits to the lessees. The royalty fixed by the Central Government vis-à-vis the sale price of minerals is inadequate. The State has adopted a policy of value addition to the mineral resources by establishment of mineral based industries in the State, thereby, generating employment opportunities and also greater revenues of the State.

**Point of issues :** (a) Whether the impugned memo is within the competence of the State under Rule 27(1)(m) of the MCR or is an additional condition of lease which is beyond the scope of Rule 27(3) of MCR? (b) Whether the restriction of sale of 50% iron ore as raw material to the industries within the State violates the right of lessees under Article 19(1)(g) read with Article 301 of the Constitution of India?

**Decision :** The High Court has stated that the impugned memo is within the competence of the State under Rule 27(1)(m) of the MCR and is not an additional condition of lease which is beyond the scope of Rule 27(3) of MCR, but there is curable procedural deficiency for want of procedure for exercise of right by the State itself and fixation of price and quantity of the minerals in respect of which right of pre-emption is exercised. The impugned order is neither beyond the scope of competence of the State nor violates the right of lessee under Article 19(1)(g) or under Article 301 of the Constitution of India.

The High Court has referred to Rule 27(1)(m) of the MCR and the definition of word pre-emption and the decision given by the Supreme Court in the case Vijayalakshmi (Smt), v. B. Himanatharaja Chetty and another (AIR 1996 SC 2146) and Bhoop Singh (AIR 1991 SC 373) and stated that the State is exercising right under the MMDR Act and MCR only and not by an administrative order unbacked by a valid law. This being the undoubted position of law, there could be no violation of Articles 19(1)(g) or 301. The lessee is acting as per statutory obligation under the covenant of lease as per the Act of Parliament to which Article 304 does not apply. Moreover, there is no challenge to the MMDR Act or MCR. The memo cannot be read as being beyond the scope of Rule 27(1)(m) and is not an additional condition. The High Court has further stated that the State has undoubted competence to pre-empt the sale of mineral and objection can at best be to the procedure and form and not to the inherent power, instead of quashing the memo as being deficient in respect of procedure, the memo can be upheld by being read as subject to procedure by which the right is exercised by State itself but benefit thereof is transferred to local industry by laying down due procedure. The State can exercise preferential right of purchase at a fair market value and evolve mechanism to enable its nominee to take delivery against price.

The High Court has reached to the conclusion that (1) Ownership of mineral is vested in the State and it has statutory preferential right to purchase the mined mineral against fair market price at the time of pre-emption; (ii) Right of pre-emption must be exercised by State itself and price fixed by it but benefit of such right can be transferred in its discretion; (iii) Impugned memo lacks procedural mechanism by which State directly exercises its right by fixing price, quantum of mineral to be purchased and beneficiary thereof but this deficiency can be cured by mechanism being laid down which is mandatory for validity of exercise of pre-emption right.

Accordingly, the High Court uphold the impugned memo as being valid exercise of right of pre-emption under Rule 27(1)(m) of MCR subject to the State evolving a mechanism to give notice to

the lessees of quantum of mineral to be purchased and the price thereof, ensuring taking delivery and payment of price within reasonable time. Such mechanism may be notified within three months. In absence thereof, on expiry of period mentioned above, the impugned memo will cease to operate.

Order accordingly.

**4. S.Sivananthavadivel, Appellant v. The District Collector, Tiruppur and another, Respondents, AIR 2014 Madras 154, Vol.101, Part 1207, July 2014.**

**Subject :** Challenging the rejection of quarry license.

**Facts :** The appellant has challenged the rejection of quarry license in Survey Nos.1033/A1A, 1033/C1, 1034/A1 and 1035/3 to an extent of 3.57.0 hectares, which was earlier granted for a period from 29.9.2006 to 28.9.2011. On the expiry of the earlier license period, the appellant has filed a fresh application, as there was no renewal clause in the original license condition.

The said application was submitted on the ground that there was a delay in commencing the quarrying operations and heavy bank loans were obtained and a lot of persons were employed to do the quarrying operations and if license is granted for a further period of five years, the Government will get more revenue. Since the said application was not considered, the appellant earlier filed a writ petition before this Court in W.P.No. 3740 of 2012 and in the said writ petition, an order was passed on 20.3.2013, directing the first respondent to consider the application of the appellant and pass order on merits, after hearing the second respondent, the local body. After the said direction was issued, the first respondent has passed an order dated 30.10.2012, rejecting the request of the appellant for grant of license for further period of five years.

The first respondent rejected the request stating that an objection was raised by the second respondent to grant quarry license to the appellant on the ground that quarrying work will affect the new crematorium, which is under construction within 100 metres from the above quarry site, which will cause danger to the public, while assembling in the crematorium. In view of the public safety and welfare, the application seeking license for a further period of five years cannot be granted. In the said order itself, it is further stated that if the appellant is aggrieved, he can file an appeal before the Director of Geology and Mining within a period of 30 days, in terms of Rule 36(C)2 of the Tamil Nadu Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 1959. The said order of the first respondent was challenged by the appellant before the learned Single Judge by filing a writ petition in W.P.No.32045 of 2012 and the learned Single Judge dismissed the said writ petition by holding that the quarrying site is within the prohibited area and hence, the rejection of the license by the first respondent can not be found fault with. Aggrieved over the same, the present writ appeal has been filed.

Learned Senior Counsel for the appellant submitted that Rule 36 of the Tamil Nadu Minor Minerals Concession Rules, 1959 (hereinafter referred to as the Rules) deals with the general restrictions in respect of quarrying operations and the prohibition to issue license. As per the said Rule, the lessees whose quarries lie within a radius of 300 metres from the "inhabited site" shall undertake blasting operations only after getting permission of the Director of Mines Safety. It is further submitted that the explanation to Rule 36 deals with "public road", "village road", "Stone"

and “inhabited site”. The objection of the second respondent for grant of license to the appellant to the above said quarrying area is not valid as the public safety is not stated as one of the criteria to be considered while granting license to quarry. In short, the word public safety is not mentioned in the said Rule. However, the first respondent travelled beyond the scope of the Rules.

Learned Counsel for the second respondent submitted that the rejection of license is on the ground that crematorium is now established within 100 metres by the second respondent and if license is granted, public safety will be affected.

**Point of issue** :. Whether the crematorium will come within the definition of 'inhabited site' or not.

**Decision** : The High Court has referred to Rule 36(1)(iii) of the above said Rules and stated that crematorium is not coming within the meaning of inhabited site or lay-out area. It is common knowledge that crematoriums are situated outside the residential area and not within the residential area. Hence, the reason stated by the first respondent that because of the existence of the crematorium, license to quarry could not be granted to the appellant, cannot be sustained. Further, with regard to the safety of the public to be assembled in the crematorium, the same is not one of the grounds stated in the Rules and the order for rejecting the license. In such view of the matter, the order of the learned Single Judge upholding the order of the first respondent dated 30.10.2012 cannot be sustained.

The High Court has directed that the matter is remitted to the first respondent to consider the issue afresh after hearing the appellant as well as the second respondent and pass fresh orders, within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

The High Court has made it clear that as on date, the appellant is not having any license to quarry. Hence, the appellant is not entitled to carry on any quarrying operation by virtue of this order. The HC has allowed the writ appeal without any costs.

Appeal allowed.

**5. M/s Olpherts Pvt. Ltd Petitioner v.Union of India & others, Respondents, AIR 2014, Madhya Pradesh 109, Vol.101, Part 1207, July, 2014.**

**Subject** : Writ petitions were filed against the order of the Revisional Authority of Central Government in revision petitions filed against the order of the State Government for granting mining lease.

**Facts:** The petitioner was granted a mining lease over an area of 147.35 acres land situated in village Jauli, Tahsil Sihora, District Jabalpur. The mining lease granted on 31<sup>st</sup> July, 1951 was for a period of 30 years, which was to end on 31<sup>st</sup> July, 1981. There were conditions mentioned in the lease for renewal of the same and the application was to be made before 12 months of expiry of the lease so granted. The petitioner preferred an application for renewal of the lease not before 12 months, calculated from the date of expiry of the mining lease. The said application was not considered at the relevant time. The petitioner preferred a revision before the Central Government under the provisions of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 and Mineral

Concession Rules, 1960 (hereinafter referred to as 'Act' and 'Rules'). However, before the revision could be decided, a notification was issued by the State Government intending allotment of the said land on lease for mining purposes on 27.07.1984. The Central Government decided the revision of the petitioner, allowed the same, vide order dated 16.11.1987 and directed the State Government to decide the application of the petitioner by a speaking order on merits. However, this order was not complied with, the application of the petitioner was not decided, therefore, a writ petition was filed by the petitioner seeking direction against the State Government to decide the application of the petitioner for renewal of the lease. The said writ petition being W.P. No.4499/1996 was disposed of vide order dated 20.12.1996. The Writ Court directed the State Government to dispose of the application made by the petitioner consistently with the directions made by the Central Government, within a period of 30 days from the date of the order.

The State Government issued a memo to the petitioner on 22.01.1997 pointing out certain defects in the application for renewal made by the petitioner and on the same date issued an order rejecting all such applications received pursuant to notification dated 27.07.1984. In fact, it appears that the State Government was willing to consider the application of the petitioner for renewal of the lease. Some query was raised on 06.02.1997 by the Additional Collector, Minerals Branch, Katni and a memo was sent to the Regional Forest Officer, Katni indicating that decision is taken to sanction renewal over the land allotted to the petitioner leaving aside the forest land. This was communicated that out of 147.47 acres, only 6.75 acres land was available for grant as mining lease and rest of the area was within the forest limits. Such a statement was made on the basis of provisions contained in Forest Conservation Act, 1980.

Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner contended that in the facts and circumstances when the Apex Court directed consideration of the application of the petitioner for renewal as an application for fresh grant along with those, who were also the applicants and whose applications were rejected and who have approached the Central Government against the said order and in case of those, Central Government has passed the order to reconsider their applications by the State Government, strictly the provisions of Section 11(2) of the Act were to be looked into and preference was to be given to the petitioner. Instead of giving preference, on flimsy ground that when earlier the lease was granted to the petitioner, it was not successfully operating the mines, the State Government has rejected the application of the petitioner. It is further contended that respondent No.3 was a defaulter, the application of the respondent No.3 was to be treated as incomplete application and virtually there was no application of the respondent No.3 to be considered in view of the provisions of Rule 22 of the Rules, therefore, the only applicant was the petitioner and its application was not to be rejected in the manner it has been. It is further contended that instead of taking action against the respondent No.3 for committing breach in respect of payment of royalty in accordance to the provisions of the Rules, even when such a statement was made before the Apex Court by filing an affidavit in the appeal filed by the petitioner, the State Government has favoured respondent No.3 for grant of lease. The application of respondent No.3 was illegally allowed. It was necessary for the revisional authority to look into these allegations, decide the revision of the petitioner in appropriate manner but the revision is

erroneously rejected. That being so, the orders, impugned in the writ petition, are liable to be quashed.

Learned Government Advocate appearing for the respondent State contended that there was no arbitrary action on the part of the respondent State. The orders of penalty were not issued against the respondent No.3 in respect of other mines. The application by respondent No.3 was made in independent capacity. It is further contended that the petitioner has not successfully operated the mines when the lease was granted to it for a long period of 30 years and that being a sole reason, application of the petitioner was rightly rejected. On appreciation of the comparative merits and feasibility for starting mining activities, the claim of respondent No.3 was rightly allowed. The revisional authority has looked into all these aspects and has rejected the revision of the petitioner on valid grounds, therefore, no interference in the order impugned is called for. Thus, it is contended that the petition is liable to be dismissed upholding the orders of the respondent State.

**Point of issues :**

(i) Which provision of law is to be made applicable, one which was available on the date of notification issued by the State Government for the purposes of determining the claim of the persons like petitioner and respondent No.3, or the law which was applicable on the date of

consideration of the application by the State Government ?

(ii) Whether any preferential right was available to the petitioner to be considered on priority over and above other applicants in terms of the directives issued by the Apex Court ?

(iii) Whether the facts, which were already considered and rejected or were put at rest by the orders of the competent authority and Courts, could be taken note of while considering the application of the petitioner and respondent No.3 afresh for grant of mining lease?

(iv) Whether the notification dated 27.07.1984 is hit by provisions of Section 2 of Forest Conservation Act, 1980, as no prior approval was obtained by the State Government before putting forest land available for mining purpose ?

**Decision :** On the above said issue No.(i), the High Court held that the application made by the respondent No.3 was to be considered for grant of mining lease in terms of the provisions of the Rules, which were applicable on the date of consideration of the said application.

On the issue No.(ii), the High Court held that no preferential right was available to the petitioner nor an error was committed by the State by not conferring the said right to the petitioner while considering the claim for grant of mining lease in terms of the directives of the Apex Court. This question is answered in this manner.

As concerned to issue No.(iii), the High Court held that the entire consideration by the respondent - State in terms of the orders of the Apex Court was not in accordance to the directions of the Apex Court and, therefore, the order of the State Government as a whole is liable to be quashed.

On the above said issue No.(iv), the High Court has stated that the provisions of Section 2 of the 1980 Act makes it incumbent on the part of the State Government or other authority to obtain prior approval before changing use of forest land for any non-forest purpose. Therefore, the lame excuse that any of the applicants have not obtained prior approval from the Central Government and therefore, their applications were rejected, cannot be accepted nor the State can be absolved of its liability of obtaining prior approval of the Central Government. In view of this also, the impugned order is bad in law and is, thus, liable to be quashed.

Accordingly, the High Court has allowed these writ petitions and stated that the impugned order of the Central Government as also the order dated 13.09.2004 passed by the respondent - State are, hereby, quashed. The matter is remitted back to the respondent - State to ascertain whether prior approval of the Central Government was obtained under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 before issuance of the notification dated 27.07.1984 in respect of the land in dispute in these writ petitions and after completing the aforesaid formality, to consider the applications of all those, who have made the applications and whose applications were rejected, including the application of the petitioner, strictly in terms of the orders of the Apex Court and to adjudge the feasibility of grant of mining lease to any of such applicant on the basis of status of their applications, as on the date of consideration. It is made clear that no preferential right would be available to the petitioner to claim allotment of lease under the provisions of Section 11 of the Act. The application of the petitioner is also to be considered only in terms of the feasibility of said application, as has been described herein above.

Thus, the High Court has disposed of all the writ petition and directed to the parties to bear their own costs.

Petition allowed.

**6. Chaina Ram, Appellant v. State of Rajasthan and others, Respondents AIR 2014 Rajasthan 122, Vol.101, Part 1208, August, 2014.**

**Subject :** Challenging the judgment and order dated 14.3.2014 for dismissing the appellant-writ-petitioner's assailment of the decision of the State Government rejecting the bid offered by him for securing the mining lease in question and ordering initiation of a fresh process therefor.

**Facts :** A Notice Inviting Tender (for short, hereinafter referred to as "the NIT") dated 20.11.2012 was issued by the Superintending Mining Engineer, Department of Mines, Government of Rajasthan, Jaipur for grant of mining lease for excavation of river sand (bajri) from rivers, drain, nadi, nala, bhala, etc. recorded as gair mumkin in the revenue records of various revenue villages of Tehsil Jaitaran District Pali. In response thereto, one M/s Kuber Associates and the appellant herein, i.e., Chaina Ram offered their bids to the tune of ₹8,65,00,000/- and ₹5,21,00,000/- respectively. As proclaimed, the tender process was to be governed by Rule 35 of the Rajasthan Minor Minerals Concession Rules, 1986 (for short, hereafter referred to as "the Rules"). Rule 35 (vi) mandated

interalia that every tender shall be accompanied by power of attorney in case the tenderer is a partnership firm/association of persons and resolution of board of Directors in case of company, as the case may be, in terms of sub-clause (d) thereof. Though the bid offered by M/s. Kuber Associates was higher than that of the appellant herein by ₹3,44,00,000/-, it was adjudged to be not in conformity with the above stipulation as its tender was not accompanied by power of attorney as required. The tender opening committee thus rejected its bid on this ground and referred the matter to the Director, Mines and the Secretary, Department of Mines, Government of Rajasthan for appropriate decision having regard to the interest of the revenue. In turn, the Director, Mines, Government of Rajasthan by his communication dated 17.4.2013 directed the Superintending Mining Engineer to issue a fresh NIT for grant of the mining lease for the area in question. The NIT as required was issued on 6.5.2013. Stirred by this initiation, the appellant as well as M/s. Kuber Associates sought to invoke the writ jurisdiction of this Court by instituting S.B.Civil Writ Petitions No.5787/2013 and 5834/2013. Incidentally, by the judgment and order impugned in the instant appeal, both these writ petitions have been dismissed.

The State-respondents in their reply pleaded that the tender furnished by M/s. Kuber Associates was not in compliance of the mandatory requirement contained in Rule 35(vi)(d) of the Rules and thus, was rightly adjudged to be invalid. According to them, the bid of the appellant-Chaina Ram was not accepted being much lower than that of M/s. Kuber Associates and further keeping in mind the interest of the revenue of the State. The respondents in their reply mentioned inter alia that in response to the fresh NIT the highest bid received was of ₹13,78,00,000/-.

The Learned Counsel for the appellant-Chaina Ram contended that the omission on the part of the tender opening committee to recommend the appellant as the provisionally selected tenderer was in contravention of Rule 35 (ix) and thus, the decision of the State Government in rejecting his tender and initiating a fresh process is patently illegal and non est in law. That having regard to the reserved price of ₹1,65,00,000/- referred to in the earlier NIT, the purported ground of interest of the revenue was of no relevance or significance whatsoever.

The Learned Additional Advocate General, however, endorsed the action of rejecting the tender of M/s. Kuber Associates and of initiating a fresh process by referring to Rule 35(vi)(d) and (xii) of the Rules. The Learned Counsel for the appellant contended that the tender opening committee had no option whatsoever to omit to do so and that on that count alone, the decision to reject his bid and direct initiation of a fresh process ought to have been adjudged to be in patent violation of the Rules and declared null and void.

The High Court opined that the findings entered in the impugned judgment and order are based on a correct appreciation of all essential facts legal and factual and do not call for any interference in the present appeal. Thus, the High Court has dismissed the appeal for want of merit.

Appeal dismissed

**7. Kilkieshwar Mining Company and another, Petitioners v. State of Uttarakhand and Others, Respondents, AIR 2014 Uttarakhand 42, Vol.101, Part 1208, AIR 2014.**

**Subject :** Challenging the order was passed by the State Government to black list the petitioners.

**Facts :** Petitioners were carrying on the business of mines and minerals in District Tehri Garhwal. Petitioner No.1 was granted mining lease on 8<sup>th</sup> May, 1987 while petitioner No.2 was granted mining lease on 16<sup>th</sup> May, 1987 initially for the period of ten years. Both the leases were renewed for five years, vide order, dated 27<sup>th</sup> June, 1994. Lease in favour of petitioner No.1 was renewed for further period of ten years on 21.07.2000 while lease in favour of petitioner No.2 was renewed for further period of ten years on 01.08.2000. Meanwhile, vide order dated 25.01.2001, leases in favour of the petitioners were cancelled and petitioners were stopped in carrying on mining operation. Order dated 25.01.2001, was challenged before the Appellate Authority. Appellate Authority was pleased to dismiss the appeal filed by the petitioners. Thereafter, representations/revisions were filed, however, same were also dismissed. Feeling aggrieved, petitioners approached this Court by way of filing Writ Petition 76 of 2008 (M/S). Writ Petition No. 76 of 2008 (M/S) was allowed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court, vide judgment, dated 23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2008 quashing the impugned order of cancelling the leases and restoring the leases in favour of the petitioners for the remaining period of renewed mining lease with liberty to the State Government to take appropriate action against the petitioners, if petitioners were found violating the conditions of the mining lease after giving adequate opportunity of being heard to the petitioners.

Order dated 23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2008, was challenged by the State Government in the Special Appeal No. 39 of 2009 before the Division Bench of this Court. Division Bench of this Court, vide judgment, dated 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2010 was pleased to dismissed the Appeal so filed by the State Government, thereby, confirming the judgment of the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court. After the judgment passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court, dated 23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2008, as confirmed by the Division Bench of this Court, petitioner moved representation before the Collector for restoration of the lease for remaining period of ten years with the stipulation that petitioners should be allowed to work for the remaining period of lease since petitioners were not allowed to work after the order dated 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2001. Thereafter, in compliance of the judgment passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court dated 23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2008, as confirmed by the Division Bench of this Court, vide judgment, dated 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2010, learned Collector Tehri Garhwal, was pleased to restore the lease, vide order, dated 10<sup>th</sup> June, 2010. Learned Collector, Tehri Garhwal, having obtained legal opinion from the District Government Counsel, on the representation of the petitioners, was pleased to renew the leases to the petitioners vide order dated 14.06.2010 till 09.06.2020. Thereafter, State Government vide order dated 6<sup>th</sup> February, 2013, was pleased to cancel the order of the Collector, dated 14.06.2010 renewing the lease till 09.06.2020 with the further direction to recover the damages from the petitioners for undertaking the illegal mining pursuant to the illegal renewal of the lease. Order dated 6<sup>th</sup> February, 2013, passed by the State Government was challenged by the petitioner in Writ Petition No. 359 of 2013 (M/S). Co-ordinate Bench of this Court, vide order, dated 22.03.2013, directed the respondents to pass order afresh after giving opportunity of being heard to the petitioners with the condition, meanwhile, impugned order dated 6<sup>th</sup> February, 2013 shall be kept in abeyance.

**Points of issues :**

(i) As to whether Learned Collector was within his jurisdiction to renew the leases from 10.06.2010 to 09.06.2020, in the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case that renewed leases for ten years on 21.07.2000 and 01.08.2000 were cancelled on 25.01.2001 and this Court was pleased to quash cancellation order dated 25.01.2001 with direction to restore the lease for remaining period, hence petitioners could not carry out mining operation between 25.01.2001 and 10.06.2010 ?

(ii) As to whether black listing of the petitioners is justified ?

**Decision :** The High Court has referred to the case *Beg Raj Singh v. State of Uttar Pradesh and others* (AIR 2003 SC 833) and stated that while lease in favour of the petitioner No.1 was renewed for a period of ten years vide order dated 21.7.2000 while lease in favour of the petitioner No.2 was renewed for further period of ten years vide order dated 1.8.2000, however, both the petitioners were not allowed to undertake mining activities w.e.f. 25.01.2001, when lease were cancelled till 10.06.2010, when lease were restored pursuant to the orders passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court dated on 22nd March, 2013 duly confirmed by the Division Bench in Special Appeal on 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2010. Therefore, petitioners were not allowed to work for nine years and 136 days for no fault of them, therefore, petitioners ought to have been allowed to work in view of the dictum of the Apex Court in the case of *Beg Raj Singh* (supra) for further period of nine years and 136 days. Learned Collector, Tehri Garhwal, therefore, seems to be justified in renewing the lease for the further period. The High Court has further stated that instead of renewing the lease till 9.6.2020, learned Collector ought to have said that lease stood renewed w.e.f. 10.6.2010 for further period of nine years and 136 days. Undisputedly, petitioners did not do any mining activities after 25.1.2001 till 10.6.2010. No document is produced or made available on the record to suggest that petitioners were undertaking any mining activities between 25.1.2001 and 10.6.2010. No show cause notice was ever issued to the petitioners for showing cause as to why they may not be black listed for such and such reasons. The High Court has also stated that order to black list the petitioners seems to be outcome of non application of mind, totally arbitrary and unjustified.

Accordingly, the High Court has allowed the writ petitions without any order as to costs and quashed the impugned orders. The High Court has held that petitioners shall be allowed to undertake mining activities for full period of ten years excluding the period petitioners have already undertaken the mining activities prior to 25.1.2001.

Petition allowed.

**8. N. Phani Kumar, Petitioner v. The Government of Andhra Pradesh by its Principal Secretary to Industries and Commerce, Hyderabad, Respondent, AIR 2014 Andhra Pradesh 132, Vol.101, Part 1209, September, 2014.**

**Subject :** Challenging the order dated 19.12.2013 passed by the Director of Mines and Geology requiring the Assistant Director of Mines and Geology, Nizamabad to submit proposals on the transfer of mining lease application after obtaining the consent from the legal heir and the present mining lease holder for taking further action in the matter.

**Facts :** The State Government, (1st respondent) passed orders through their G.O.Ms.No.352, Industries and Commerce (M.III) Department, dated 17.12.2007 granting mining lease for Quartz over an extent of 3.920 hectares situated in Sy.No.629/2 of Nandipet Village and Sy.Nos.62 and 63 of Chimarajpally Village of Nandipet Mandal, Nizamabad District for a period of 20 years in favour of M/s. Sri Venkateswara Minerals subject to obtaining Consent For Establishment (CFE) from the A.P.Pollution Control Board and subject to satisfaction of Mineral Concession Rules, 1960 (henceforth called Rules) and the Provisions of Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 (for brevity referred to as Act). The State Government passed further orders through their Memo No.1090 dated 11.02.2009, after due consideration of the request of M/s. Sri Venkateswara Minerals, granted extension of time for a further period of six months from the last expiry date for execution of lease deed. Accordingly, upon satisfactorily complying with all statutory requirements and other related formalities, a mining lease has been executed on 28.07.2009 for a period of 20 years, i.e., up to 27.07.2029, according permission to commence mining operations over the leased extent of land. It appears on 28.10.2009, an application for transfer of the mining lease for the unexpired portion in favour of the writ petitioner has been filed. Sri Mohd.Abdul Hai, the sole proprietor of M/s Sri Venkateswara Minerals signed the transfer application and also filed an affidavit setting out that due to financial and age related problems he desired to transfer the mining lease in favour of the writ petitioner herein for the unexpired lease period up to 27.07.2029. That application has been processed by the Assistant Director of Mines and Geology, Nizamabad, who recommended the transfer to be accorded. The Zonal Joint Director of Mines and Geology, Hyderabad, has also considered the matter and agreed with the recommendations of the Assistant Director of Mines and Geology for transfer of the mining lease in favour of the writ petitioner herein for the unexpired portion. The Director of Mines and Geology, through his communication, dated 02.06.2010 required Sri Mohd.Abdul Hai to submit the necessary declaration within 15 days by way of notarized affidavit with regard to the consideration amount received by the transferor from the transferee so as to consider the justification for the transfer proposals and also to make an assessment as to whether the transfer proposal is a speculative one or not. It is the case of the petitioner that Sri Mohd.Abdul Hai has accordingly submitted the notarized affidavit vouching for the fact that he has received an amount of ₹50,000/towards consideration for the transfer of the mining lease in favour of the petitioner herein as that was the amount incurred by him towards the preliminary expenditure. Thereafter, the proposal for transfer has been processed once again to the Director of Mines and Geology for his consideration.

Sri Mohd. Abdul Hai expired on 26.09.2010. Hence, his wife, the 5<sup>th</sup> respondent herein filed an application before the Assistant Director of Mines and Geology, who passed orders on 03.05.2012 declaring her as the successor to the lease. The petitioner herein has challenged the validity of the said order dated 03.05.2012 by instituting Writ Petition No.22279 of 2012 in this Court urging that as by 03.05.2012 the transfer application of the lease in his favour is pending consideration and hence, the 5th respondent herein could not have been declared as successor. That writ petition was disposed of by this Court holding that the legal representative of the deceased Mohd.Abdul Hai is certainly entitled to succeed to the mining lease and no exception can be taken thereto by the petitioner. The grievance of the petitioner is that instead of independently determining the transfer application, the Director of Mines and Geology passed the impugned order requiring the Assistant

Director of Mines and Geology, Nizamabad to submit proposals on the transfer of mining lease application after obtaining the consent from the Legal heir and the present mining lease holder Smt.Bilqui Sultana for taking further course of action in the matter. Hence, this writ petition is instituted.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner contended that all that is required to be done for causing the transfer of the mining lease has already been done and hence, the formal order of transfer has got to be passed by the State Government in accordance with Rule 37 of the Mineral Concession Rules. It is further contended that there was no necessity to obtain the consent of the legal heir of the deceased Mohd. Abdul Hai. Further, the analogy of Rule 25A can be applied to the transfer applications as well. It is also contended that as per the meaning of the term "transfer" employed under Section 5 of the Transfer of Property Act, the transfer of the property in question shall be deemed to have been effected and neither the intervention of the State nor the consent of the legal heir is warranted. It is contended that a transfer in property takes effect from the date of execution of the deed of transfer, but not necessarily from the date of its registration. Therefore, Sri Mohd. Abdul Hai having already executed a deed of transfer in favour of the petitioner herein, the question of obtaining the consent of the successors of Sri Mohd. Abdul Hai would not simply arise now.

**Decision:** The High Court has referred to Rule 37 and Rule 37A of the Rules and stated that in the instant case, upon death of Sri Mohd.Abdul Hai, his wife filed an application to become his successor lessee and that was ordered on 03.05.2012. Therefore, there is a change of status with regard to the mining lease also on and from 03.05.2012. Sri Mohd. Abdul Hai, became the lessee of the mining lease. If the transfer had occasioned with the consent of the State Government prior thereto, the 5<sup>th</sup> respondent (the wife of the deceased original lessee) could not have possibly succeeded to the mining lease. That is the reason why this Court while dealing with W.P.No.22279 of 2012 on the previous occasion has upheld the order declaring the 5th respondent herein as the successor lessee of the mining lease. With this change of the lessee of the mining lease, if any transfer application is to be considered or accorded, that can be done only with the consent of the existing lessee. The previous lessee, with his death, naturally lost all his rights with regard to the mining lease granted by the State Government. On or after 03.05.2012, the 5th respondent became the lessee for the balance period of mining lease. Hence, it is her consent for transfer, which is vitally needed. The agreement, or arrangement if any, between Sri Mohad.Abdul Hai and the writ petitioner herein entered prior to 03.05.2012 having not fructified into a transfer in favour of the petitioner, the said application cannot be taken up for independent consideration without the consent of the 5th respondent herein, who is the existing lessee of the mining lease. The High Court has further stated that Section 4(1) read with Rule 37, requires specific order of grant to be made by the State Government. That is the reason why upon granting a consent for transfer of a mining lease, the Rules specify execution of a separate transfer deed in Form - O, so as to ensure that the transferee is bound by all the conditions of the grant. There was no transfer deed executed in the instant case in favour of the petitioner. Hence, the contention that the consent of the State is bound to be accorded even without the consent of the present lessee the fifth respondent and that the legal heirs of the deceased original lease are bound by the transfer application, cannot be accepted. The terms legal heirs or assigns or agents mentioned in the original mining lease, are intend to bind them

jointly and severally with the original lessee, by the terms and conditions stipulated in the mining lease. It is not meant to cover any possible future transfer applications.

Accordingly, for want of merit, the High Court has dismissed writ petition, at the admission stage, without any costs. The Miscellaneous petitions, if any pending, in this writ petition, shall stand closed.

The High Court has further ordered/held that the miscellaneous petitions, if any pending in this writ petition, shall stand closed.

Petition dismissed.

## SECTION -2

### Trend in Mining, Prospecting and Reconnaissance

#### 2.1 TREND IN MINING

##### A. Mining Lease Granted

During the period under review, the information pertaining to the grant of 270 leases covering an area of about 2413.96 hectares was received. Of these, China clay accounted for 40 leases, followed by Silica sand 9, Ball clay & Quartz ( 6 each) & Siliceous earth 5, Gypsum 4, Dolomite, Laterite, Limestone & Red Ochre (3 each) Soapstone 2, and White clay 1 lease. In addition to these 185 mining leases granted were in respect of two or more minerals in association.

Reviewing areawise, mining lease granted for limestone accounted for 1152.91 ha, followed by China clay 171.69 ha, Quartz 55.05 ha, Silica sand 35.19 ha, Ball clay 26.29 ha, Siliceous earth 23.21 ha, Laterite 18.53 ha, Gypsum 17.50 ha, Red ochre 13.82 ha, Dolomite 13.60 ha, Soapstone 9.89 ha, and White clay 4.06 ha. This is followed by group of minerals 872.22 ha.

Reviewing statewise, number of Mining leases and area granted in Rajasthan 248 with 1147.42 ha, followed by Madhya Pradesh 3 with 974.02 ha, Telangana 4 with 198.80 ha, Andhra Pradesh 2 with 39.70 ha, Gujarat 7 with 28.98 ha, Chhattisgarh 3 with 13.90 ha, Uttarakhand 2 with 9.89 ha and Kerala 1 with 1.25 ha.

The mineralwise number of mining leases granted together with lease area and details of mining leases granted are given in Tables 1 A & 1 B, respectively.

## B. Mining Leases Executed

During the period under review, the information pertaining to the execution of 131 Mining Leases covering an area of about 717.56 hectares was received. Of these, Ball clay and Gypsum accounted for 09 leases each, followed by China clay 05 leases, Silica Sand 03 leases, and Dolomite, Laterite, Quartz, Red Ochre & Soapstone with 01 lease each. In addition to these 100 mining leases executed were in respect of two or more minerals in association.

Reviewing areawise, Quartz accounted for about 48.18 ha, followed by Ball clay 41.32 ha, Gypsum 40.56 ha, China clay 21.89 ha, Silica sand 12.86 ha, Soapstone 4.85 ha, Red Ochre 4.36 ha, Dolomite 4.05 ha, and Laterite 1.62 ha. Mining leases executed in respect of two or more minerals covered 537.87 ha.

Reviewing statewise, number of mining leases and area executed in Rajasthan were 126 leases with an area about 655.15 ha, Kerala 2 leases with 5.33 ha, followed by Andhra Pradesh 1 lease with 48.18 ha, Telangana 1 lease with 4.05 ha and Uttarakhand 1 lease with 4.85 ha .

The mineralwise number of mining leases executed together with lease area and details of mining leases executed are given in Tables 2A & 2B, respectively.

### C. Mining Leases Renewed

During the period under review, the information pertaining to the renewal of 11 mining leases covering an area of 1328.92 hectares was received. Of these, Limestone accounted for 2 leases followed by Silica sand 2 leases and Soapstone 1 lease. In addition to these, 6 mining leases were renewed in respect of two or more minerals in association.

Reviewing areawise, limestone accounted 916.63 ha followed by Silica sand 25.17 ha and Soapstone 86.52 ha. Mining leases renewed in respect of two or more minerals covered 300.60 ha.

Reviewing statewise, number of mining leases renewed and area covered in Rajasthan were 8 leases covering 1056.73 ha, followed by Uttarakhand with 2 leases covering 251.60 ha and Uttar Pradesh with 1 lease covering 20.59 ha.

The mineralwise, number of mining leases renewed together with lease area and details of mining leases renewed are given in Tables 3 A & 3 B, respectively.

## 2.2 TREND IN PROSPECTING

### A. Prospecting Licences Granted

During the period under review, information pertaining to the grant of 66 prospecting licences covering an area of 5558.51 hectares was received. Of these, Silica sand accounted for about 23 licences followed by Limestone 09, Laterite & Limestone (cement grade) each 03 licences, China clay, Manganese ore & Soapstone (02 each) and Dolomite, Garnet (Abrasive), Graphite, Iron ore, Pyrophyllite & Rock Phosphate each 01 licence. In addition to these, 16 prospecting licences were granted in respect of two or more minerals in association.

Reviewing area-wise, Licences granted for Limestone (cement grade) was accounted for about 3588.90 ha, followed by Silica sand 966.68 ha, Limestone 268.06 ha, Garnet (Abrasive) 160.77 ha, China clay 50 ha, Manganese ore 46.04 ha, Laterite 25.20 ha, Rock Phosphate 19.36 ha, Soapstone 13.43 ha, Pyrophyllite 6.84 ha, Dolomite 6.61 ha, Graphite 4.44 ha and Iron ore 4.09 ha. Licences granted in respect of two or more minerals in association covered about 398.09 ha.

Reviewing state-wise, number of prospecting licences and area granted in Rajasthan was 36 with 4994.48 ha, followed by Madhya Pradesh 17 with 251.23 ha, Tamil Nadu 08 with 249.97 ha, Telangana 01 with 40.70 ha, Uttarakhand 02 with 13.43 ha, Jharkhand 01 with 4.44 ha, and Chhattisgarh 01 with 4.26 ha.

The mineral-wise, number of prospecting licences granted together with area and details of prospecting licences granted are given in Tables 13 A & 13 B, respectively.

## **B. ABROAD**

### **Why Nickel Prices are Surging**

Nickel prices have surged nearly seven per cent in the past month with fears over supplies from Russia adding to Indonesian curbs on shipments of unprocessed ores. Among base metals, nickel has been the best performer in the March quarter, gaining nearly 15 per cent. The rise is the most in the last four years. Nickel ruled near 11-month high of \$16,115 a tonne for May contracts. In the domestic futures market, too, nickel has gained nearly 10 per cent. On MCX, nickel for delivery in June ruled at ₹ 985.20 a kg. That nickel was expected to surge this year was no doubt, given the problems of supplies from Indonesia.

### **World copper market will be in surplus this year**

After four consecutive years of apparent deficit, the world copper market could witness a production surplus relative to demand in 2014, according to projections made by International Copper Study Group (ICSG). Demand this year is expected to lag production. So, world production of refined copper is expected to exceed demand for refined by about 400,000 tonnes. Interestingly, another surplus year could occur in 2015. Although growth in usage is expected to continue, owing to an increase in refined output that exceeds the expected growth in usage, a surplus is likely again. The ICSG has however cautioned that the global market balances could vary from these projections owing to numerous factors that could reduce or enhance projections for both production and usage.

### **China, Japan power uranium demand**

The positive correlation between economic growth and energy consumption is well known. Countries have begun to lay greater emphasis on energy security and a mix of different forms of energy sources, including fossil fuels and renewables. Major economies around the world favour nuclear power plants for which uranium is a critical input.

The world uranium market has been unimpressively steady in recent times with spot prices staying put at around \$35 a pound. The spot price in 2012 averaged \$49/lb, but fell to \$39/lb in 2013. Uranium supplies fell marginally last year due to lower volumes of recycled material and slower mine supply growth.

While production in Kazakhstan grew, there were disruptions elsewhere (Niger, Namibia and Australia). However, muted demand growth, burdensome inventory and contract coverage of utilities for forward positions pressured prices lower. In 2014, fundamentals should be relatively more positive. This follows improving demand and start of supply rationalisation.

Taking a three-to-six-months view, while demand growth will be modest, supply growth will be weak and inventory levels high; a steady sequential gain in prices can be expected in the second half of the year. Prices are expected to be in the \$35-40 range, projected to gradually move up by \$ 4-5 a pound each year over the next three years.

At the same time, inventory overhang and existing contract coverage of utilities over the next few years means the pace of price strength will be modest.

Although the current spot prices are below estimated costs, higher prices from contract selling appear to have provided enough relief to keep miners going, according to industry experts. At the same time, some miners have buckled under pressure and announced mine idling or capacity reduction.

Some have postponed capex expansion plans. Although weaker supply and rising demand should tighten the market, uranium is still a surplus market and will remain so until 2017.

### **A growing market: vermiculite and perlite in horticulture**

Because of their specific mineral properties, both perlite and vermiculite lend themselves to a variety of commercial applications, such as in construction and packaging. One niche use is the application of perlite and vermiculite in horticulture, owing to the structure of both minerals, which allows them to control soil moisture and host mineral fertiliser.

Vermiculite is a hydrated magnesium aluminium silicate, with typical composition being 38% to 46% silica (SiO<sub>2</sub>), 10% to 16% alumina (Al<sub>2</sub>O<sub>3</sub>), 16% to 35% magnesia (MgO), and other compounds such as calcium, iron, potassium and titanium oxide.
