# Talking the talk

In late July, at FT Live's Climate for Change event, in London, UK, BHP CEO Andrew Mackenzie declared to the world the mining giant's stance on anthropogenic climate change: "The evidence is abundant: global warming is indisputable.

He also used the opportunity to announce the company's new five-year, US\$400 million Climate Investment Program, which seeks to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from its operations as well as its whole value chain.

The latter promise is what caught many people's attention, as it means the miner will also be keeping an eye on the users of its products, including iron ore, metallurgical and thermal coal, as well as oil and gas.

Mining, an industry still struggling with its 'unclean' image in the public eye, definitely needs a bit of good PR in this vein. But talk, as they say, is cheap.

In his speech, Mackenzie did point out that "performance against emissions targets has been considered in BHP's executive remuneration plans" for many years already.

Now the plan is to further reinforce this link between pay and pollution. It'll certainly be interesting to see what effect this will have on the miner's decarbonisation work going forward.

After Mackenzie's big announcement, controversial Australian conservative commentator Andrew Bolt - he of mocking-teen-environmentalactivist-Greta-Thunberg fame – asked in his column: "If BHP's chief really believes climate change is 'indisputable' and killing the planet, why isn't the company closing down coal mines?"

Despite the flippant question - and putting aside who was asking it - it does give the industry and related stakeholders something to chew over.

BHP has reportedly been making plans to exit thermal coal. Apparently, it's looking for options to divest this side of its business, which includes two assets in Australia and

Furthermore, the company's chief financial officer Peter Beaven told investors earlier this year that it might be phasing out thermal coal "potentially sooner than expected"

The move would also be following in the footsteps of rival Rio Tinto, which sold the remainder of its coal assets last year

To date, BHP has already left the World Coal Association, but remains a member of the Minerals Council of Australia - for now at least

The Guardian reported that the lobby group is linked to the Coal21 research organisation (although the council denies this), which is planning to launch a pro-coal advertising campaign in Australia.

Apparently, the miner had already been reassessing its membership, but this might add further pressure for the company to split ways with the council - to save face if nothing

After all, how else will Mackenzie be able to stand behind his words: "All emitters, resource companies, customers, consumers must play their part together with governments to meet the climate challenge."




