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PREFACE

The National Mineral Inventory (NMI) is an important activity as per Charter of Functions of Indian Bureau of Mines (IBM). This was initiated in 1968 and since then the inventory is being prepared and updated quinquennially with some need based intermediate updation of major minerals.

The National Mineral Inventory's leasehold (excluding minor minerals) data has been updated as on 01.04.2025 using digital modules developed by the Indian Bureau of Mines, namely the NMI–Mineral Tenement System (NMI-MTS) Module, Mining Plan Approval System (MPAS) Module and Returns Module. The freehold data input for NMI is collected from various agencies and stakeholders who engaged in exploration and exploitation both in Central and State Governments as well as public and private sectors which also provide the necessary information required for database updation.

The mineral resource data generated by NMI is disseminated through various publications of Indian Bureau of Mines and being used by Government and Industries. The National Mineral Inventory - At a Glance is aimed at giving a quick browser of the country's resource wealth.

The publication provides reserves & resources as per United Nations Framework Classification (UNFC) which has been adopted in the Indian Mineral Sector and basis for freehold and leasehold areas. A brief explanatory note on UNFC has also been incorporated in this publication. The resource data has been provided in the form of tables. These tables give distribution of Mineral-wise, State-wise and All India Resources along with its UNFC codes and terminologies.

This publication is designed to provide a quick and broad qualitative scenario of mineral resources of the country as per UNFC. We welcome valuable suggestions and feedback from the readers for further improvement of this publication of updated '**National Mineral Inventory - At a Glance (As on 01.04.2025)**'.
